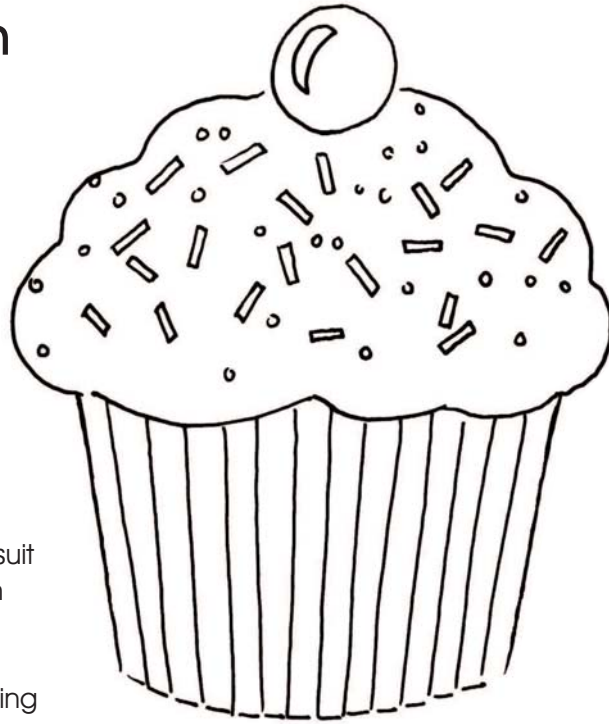


# Pentel<sup>®</sup> Arts<sup>™</sup> Fabric Fun<sup>®</sup> for Baby

## Little Cupcake Design for Bib & Bodysuit

### INSTRUCTIONS

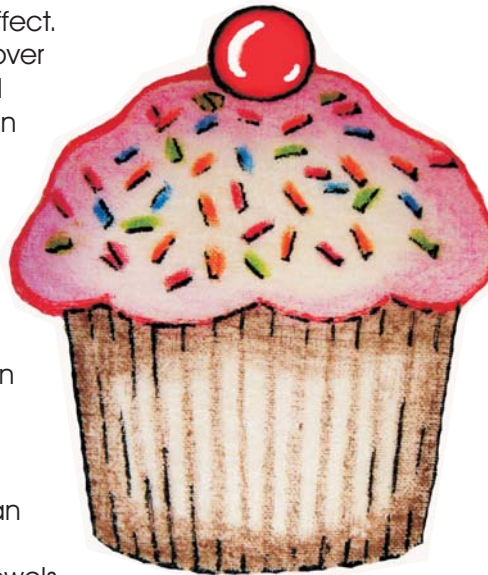
1. Download and print this page.
2. Cut around design sketch so it fits inside bodysuit. Place between layers of bodysuit or beneath bib. Leave space for adding words or a name, if you want. Pin or tape in place.
3. Trace all lines of design onto bib or bodysuit with Gel Roller for Fabric pen. Remove design paper after tracing.
4. Color design with Fabric Fun dye sticks using color image as a reference. Press firmly with dye sticks to get stronger colors (around the edges of each shape); use less pressure for lighter shades (inside shapes) to get a three-dimensional effect. You can also add white or apply two colors over same area to get a new shade. Background color of bodysuit will effect color of Fabric Fun design; adjust colors accordingly.
5. Blend colors with finger to get a softer transition between colors and fewer coloring lines.
6. Place paper towels under colored design (inside bodysuit) and over it. Iron on "Cotton" or hot setting to heat set Fabric Fun colors. *Tip: Keep iron moving and be careful not to scorch.* Replace top paper towel with a clean paper towel; iron again until no excess color comes out onto the towel. Remove paper towels.
7. Personalize with a name or saying using the Gel Roller for Fabric, and you have a fabulous baby gift!



### DESIGN TIPS for tracing with Gel Roller for Fabric

*If it is difficult to see design through fabric, put it on a glass table top with a light underneath or on a sunny window, but be sure you keep the Gel Roller vertical so ink flows properly.*

### DESIGN TIPS for coloring with Fabric Fun Dye Sticks

*Practice coloring on paper towel before working on clothing.*

*Hold fabric flat around the area you are coloring.*

*Work from top of design down or place a paper towel between your hand and the fabric to avoid smearing color.*
